Choosing your degree

Our degree courses reflect the very latest developments in econonomics and data science. You will examine how economics applies to real life. As you progress through your modules, you will become equipped with the knowledge, skills and experiences essential to advance your future career.

Our degrees provide an excellent background for starting a career or for further study. There is a common set of mandatory modules that provide training in theoretical and quantitative economic analysis. Financial and Business Economics students specialise in the areas of financial markets and industrial economics.

Our first year modules for our main courses include Principles of economics, Applied economics and policy and Data skills for economist. Courses become more specialised in the second and third years and you will have freedom to choose optional modules to suit your interests.

A number of our degrees offer exemptions by CIMA (Chartered Institute of Management Accountants).

Departmental support

We provide additional tuition sessions for all the core modules, which are held in small groups and are arranged by demand. Studying here, you are also assigned a personal advisor from among our academics who will provide you with extra academic support and guidance throughout your studies. As students join us with varying mathematical backgrounds, we also run additional maths tutorials on a regular basis for the modules containing a quantitative element and a math boot camp at the beginning of your studies.

We use online tools and learning platforms such as Moodle, MyEconLab and MyMathLab. For your convenience, we also provide free eBooks for select modules.

Facilities

To support students studying Economics we have a dedicated building where all our staff and facilities are located, including an experimental lab. Computers and library resources for students are conveniently located a couple of minutes away, and our students also have access to a Bloomberg Terminal. In addition, undergraduate students have exclusive use of the Economics Hub, which can be used as both a social and study space.
